CD Cover – Manipulating Colour

Adjusting colours is an interesting way to make an image more striking.

- 1. Open Photoshop
- 2. Open the image you want to edit: click File > Open and find the image
- 3. Crop the image first use the crop tool and choose a square crop at the top

Editing the colour

- At the top, click Layer > New Adjustment Layer > choose Vibrance > click OK
 A section appears on the right with some sliders in it
- Drag the Vibrance slider towards the <u>right</u> to make the colours more vivid
- 6. Then drag it towards the **left** to see what happens
- 7. Hide the layer by clicking on the eye in the Layer
 Stack at the bottom right
- Now go Layer > New Adjustment Layer > Hue/Saturation > OK

Vibrance: Vibrance: Saturation: Opacity: 100% Lock: Comparison: Vibrance 1 Saturation: S



A new set of sliders appear

- Try sliding the Saturation slider to the <u>right</u> first. This also makes the colours stronger
- Then move the Saturation slider to the <u>left</u> to see what happens there
- 11. Make sure the saturation is back on the **<u>right</u>** somewhere
- Now try moving the Hue slider around
 This actually changes the colours in the image
- 13. Decide which layers you want active by using the eyes in the Layer Stack

Now add text to your CD cover for the title and band name

Saving the file for use

14. Click File > Save As and give the file a name

BUT: this is a Photoshop file format. You can't use it for anything

15. Click File > Export > Export As and export the image as a JPG to use it
